#### Call to Order -

- A. Attendance Chair Oliver called the meeting to order at 3:00 P.M. A quorum of members was present.
- II. **Public Comment** No members of the public were present.
- III. Incumbent Worker Training Overview Berger stated while most of our committees focus on job seekers, this newest committee focus is on employers. The first topic staff is bringing to the committee is the Incumbent Worker Training Program. Berger explained this past February, the Full Board approved an updated the Incumbent Worker Training (IWT) Policy. Under the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) the strategy was to avert layoffs and our employers didn't take advantage of the program. Under the Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA) the strategy is to train the current workforce. It is a much broader reach. Members were provided an overview page and a copy of the policy. Berger reviewed the policy details with the committee.

#### IV. Project Application Review

- A. Adient LLC, Sycamore, IL The committee members reviewed the application which requests \$15,000 in funding which is the partial cost of total training project costing \$160,000 to train 320 employees in new product implementation. Staff provided a company overview and verified Adient LLC met general eligibility guidelines. The committee was in agreement regarding utilizing LWIA (5) WIOA IWT funding for the Adient LLC training application.
- B. Power Packaging, St. Charles, IL The committee members reviewed the application which requests \$5,760 in funding to train (7) seven maintenance workers in Intermediate, Level 2 Electrical Training. Power Packaging has been unable to recruit maintenance workers at this level. Staff provided a company overview and verified Power Packaging met general eligibility guidelines. The committee was in agreement regarding utilizing LWIA (5) WIOA IWT funding for the Power Packaging Training Application.
- V. **Adjournment** Oliver adjourned the meeting at 4:00 P.M.

- IWT is a work-based training strategy.
- IWT provides employers with the opportunity to build and maintain a qualified workforce.
- > IWT provides workers with the opportunity to enhance existing skills, learn new skills, gain credentials, retain employment or increase earnings potential.
- ➤ IWT can be used to help avert potential layoffs or increase the skill levels of employees/competiveness of employers.

<u>Award Criteria:</u> Employers must meet general eligibility criteria to apply for local IWT funding and the following factors will be considered when awarding IWT training:

- 1. The number of employees participating in the training;
- 2. The characteristics of the incumbent workers to be trained and how they would benefit from retention or advancement;
- 3. The wage and benefit levels of the participants (before and after training);
- 4. The quality of the training, including the relationship of the training to the competitiveness of the employer. Whenever possible, the training should allow the participant to gain industry-recognized training experience and/or lead to industry-recognized credentials and/or an increase in wages;
- 5. Availability of other employer-provided training and advancement opportunities evidencing long-term investment in the employee work base; and
- 6. Commitment to engage in a long-term relationship with OCR by posting new positions or employment opportunities (such as backfill positions) on the locally published job board.

<u>Training:</u> May be conducted at the employer's facility, training facility or a combination of sites through:

- 1. Illinois public or private educational institutions;
- In-state or out-of-state private training organizations;
- 3. Professional trainers hired by the employer;
- 4. In-house trainers; or
- 5. Combination of training providers.

Allowable Costs: Costs necessary to conduct the training are allowable, but are limited to:

- Training development;
- 2. Instructor wages;
- 3. Tuition and fees;
- 4. Training materials and supplies;
- 5. Off-site training facility costs; or
- 6. Fees for technical or professional certifications and/or licensures.

<u>Funding and Match:</u> The maximum funding award is \$15,000 per year per employer, and employers are required to provide matching support (in-kind or direct financial support) to the project based on the employer size as follows:

Number of Employees	Minimum Company Match Requirement
50 or fewer full-time employees	10%
51-100 full-time employees	25%
101+ full-time employees	50%

<u>Procurement and Contracts:</u> A minimum of three quotes are required for procurement purposes; however, the employer is not required to select the lowest bid. Upon project approval, a contract/written agreement that outlines who is providing the training, the type and location of the training to be provided, the length and cost of the training, and the amount of employer-matching support and manner in which the match will be contributed to the project must be executed.

<u>Outcomes</u>: The employer must identify outcomes to be achieved by the incumbent worker training with an explanation as to how each outcome is important to the employer and its employees and how the proposed training project will produce the outcomes stated in the application.

In August 2016, the ISO (International Organization for Standardization) and IATF (International Automotive Task Force) announced the replacement of the automotive industry's most widely used global standard for quality management, ISO/TS 16949, with IATF 16949. Organizations are required to integrate and implement the changes in their Quality Management Systems in order to be in compliance with the new industry standards.

Elgin Industries' current TS 16949 certification expires at the end of 2017. As a Tier One supplier for automotive engine and chassis components, Elgin Industries is required by their OEM customer-base (Ford, GM, and Chrysler) to maintain the most current industry-recognized certification for quality management. Therefore, as the standards evolve in the automotive industry, it is vital for the company to be in compliance with these requirements in order to retain their OEM customer-base, remain competitive in the industry, and to allow employees to be equipped with the necessary in-demand skills and knowledge.

The requested training project will provide employees with the necessary knowledge to support the company in achieving compliance/certification to the new quality standard, including evaluation of gaps from the old TS to the new IATF, how to implement and transition to IATF-1649:2016, and internal auditor skills-upgrade training.

# Summary of training project budget, including Employer Matching Contribution source/amount Minimum Required Employer Match: \$7,500.00 (50% of IWT Award) TOTAL Estimated Cost of Training (excluding staff wages): \$29,450.00 Employer Match Source: Additional training costs above IWT award amount (wages paid to employees during training to be used as back-up).

The IWT Grant funds will help to offset the instructor/course costs and book/material expenses associated with delivering the IATF 16949 Transition Implementation and Auditing training to 18 employees (QA personnel and staff management). A majority of the training (88 hours) will take place on-site at Elgin Industries, and the remaining AIAG Lead Auditor Training course (40 hours) will require the QA Manager and QA Engineer to travel to Southfield, Michigan.

Elgin Industries has identified the total cost of this training to be approximately \$29,450.00, which is primarily made up of the instructor/course costs. Therefore, the Employer Match requirement for this project will be met through additional training costs above the IWT award amount. Employees will also be paid their wages while participating in the required training, which will be used as back-up support for the Employer Match requirement, if needed.

In August 2016, the ISO (International Organization for Standardization) and IATF (International Automotive Task Force) announced the replacement of the automotive industry's most widely used global standard for quality management, ISO/TS 16949, with IATF 16949. As of September 2018, all ISO/TS 16949:2009 certificates will be invalid, and, as of October 2017, organizations can ONLY be audited and certified to IATF 16949 standard. Organizations will have to integrate and implement the changes in their Quality Management Systems from publication of the IATF 16949 standard (October 2016) and prior to the transition audit (May 2018- latest recommended date). According to IATF 16949, Auditors must acquire authorization to perform audits by passing an examination.

Elgin Industries' current TS 16949 certification expires at the end of 2017. As a Tier One supplier for automotive engine and chassis components, Elgin Industries is required by our OEM customer-base (Ford, GM, and Chrysler) to maintain the most current industry-recognized certification for quality management. The requested training project will provide employees with the necessary knowledge to support the company in achieving compliance/certification to the new quality standard, including evaluation of gaps from the old TS to the new IATF, how to implement and transition to IATF-1649:2016, and internal auditor skills-upgrade training.

Classroom training will be provided for up to ten (10) employees (QA personnel and staff management) on implementation and transition from TS to IATF-16949:2016. Up to eight (8) employees will be designated as Internal Auditors for the company and will receive skills-upgrade training from TS auditing requirements to IATF 16949:2016 requirements. Then, in turn, a designated Elgin trainer will provide classroom training on the transition to our remaining workforce, approximately 160 employees.

ISO/TS 16949, a technical specification for automotive sector quality management systems, has become one of the most widely used international standards in the automotive industry, harmonizing the different assessment and certification systems in the global automotive supply chain. On October 3, 2016, IATF 16949:2016 was published by the IATF and supersedes and replaces the current ISO/TS 16949, defining the requirements of a quality management system for organizations in the automotive industry.

Elgin Industries' current TS 16949 certification expires at the end of 2017. As a Tier One supplier for automotive engine and chassis components, Elgin Industries is required by our OEM customer-base (Ford, GM, and Chrysler) to maintain the most current industry-recognized certification for quality management. Therefore, as the Quality Management System (QMS) standards evolve in the automotive industry, it is vital for our company to be in compliance with these requirements in order to retain our OEM customer-base, remain competitive in the industry, and to allow our employees to be equipped with the necessary in-demand skills and knowledge.

Elgin Industries is requesting \$15,000 (maximum IWT Grant award amount) to assist with the costs associated with implementing the training for the new quality standard.

Specifically, the IWT Grant funds will be used to offset the costs required to train 18 employees (QA personnel and staff management) on the implementation and transition from TS to IATF-16949:2016, including Internal Auditor skills-upgrade training. The total cost of the project is estimated to be approximately \$29,450, which is primarily made up of instructor/trainer costs and required book/material expenses.

We have estimated the total cost of the training project to be approximately \$29,450; therefore, we estimate the contribution amount to be approximately \$14,450, which exceeds the minimum required match amount. Elgin Industries will also be paying wages to employees while they are participating in training, so this will be a back-up for the support amount, if needed.




