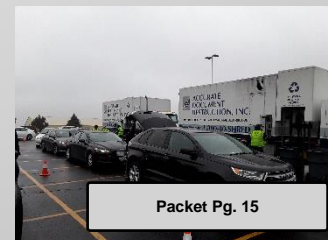
What:

- **Electronics** see list of [accepted items](#). TVs and Monitors have a fee.
- **Books** (hard and soft covers, any age, any condition, free of cost) are accepted at all scheduled collection events.
- **Paint** Liquid latex & oil-based paints will be accepted for a per-can fee. Oil-based paint can be dropped for free at Naperville HHW facility.
- **Shredding** residential confidential documents onsite. See here for the guidelines and limitations.

Costs:

TVs and Monitors cost \$25 (under 21" measured diagonally across the screen) or \$35 (21" and over).

Paint cans cost (Latex: \$3/gal, \$10/5-gal; Oil: \$8/gal, \$20/5-gal).
