What is the Kane County Future Workforce Leaders program?

The Kane County Future Workforce Leaders Program provides training opportunities for qualified students. The program offers financial assistance for students looking to earn a High School Equivalency, occupational training certificate, or participate in a work experience opportunity.

Some occupational areas include:

- Automotive
- Certified nurse assistant
- Computer numerical control operator (CNC)
- Dental assistant
- Fire science and safety
- Heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and refrigeration (HVACR)
- Medical coding/billing
- Pharmacy technician
- Welding

Who qualifies for the program?

If you are out of school or a recent high school graduate, between the ages of 16 and 24, reside in Kane County, and meet program guidelines, you may qualify for the Future Workforce Leaders Program.

What are the benefits associated with the program?

Advantages of qualifying for the program may include:

- Paid work experience and pre-internships.
- Job search assistance and workshops.
- Transportation assistance.
- Counseling and mentoring.
- Tutoring.
- Company tours and college tours.

Future Workforce Leaders offers a unique opportunity for participants to gain work experience and learn about various career pathways. After completing career exploration, participants can choose from a variety of opportunities to gain experience and knowledge in their chosen field.
